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oral history is a technique for generating and preserving original historically interesting information primary source material from personal recollections through planned recorded interviews oral history is a field of study and a method of gathering preserving and interpreting the voices and memories of people communities and participants in past events oral history is the collection and study of historical information about people families important events or everyday life using audiotapes videotapes or transcriptions of planned interviews oral history is a technique for generating and preserving original historically interesting information primary source material from personal recollections through planned recorded interviews this method of interviewing is used to preserve the voices memories and perspectives of people in history this chapter discusses what oral history is why we conduct oral history interviews how oral history methods have evolved what encompasses the oral history process how one goes about interviewing people for historical information and how to evaluate oral interviews and integrate them into your research four key elements of oral history work are preparation interviewing preservation and access oral historians should give careful consideration to each at the start of any oral history project regardless of whether it is comprised of one or many interviews since the initial 1968 goals and guidelines was issued the theory and practice of oral history in the us has become more complicated and nuanced influenced by both the expanding base of its practitioners and shifting intellectual paradigms in a host of disciplines what is oral history the oral history association provides the following definition oral history is a field of study and a method of gathering preserving and interpreting the voices and memories of people communities and participants in past events this guide brings together information on oral history methodology as well as a list of select oral history collections and resources at duke libraries this handout will help you figure out how to use oral histories in essays it will give you suggestions for how to prepare for and conduct oral history interviews and help you determine based on your context and purpose how to integrate raw material into your essay what is oral history oral history is the systematic collection of living people s testimony about their own experiences oral history is not folklore gossip hearsay or rumor oral historians attempt to verify their findings analyze them and place them in an accurate historical context an oral history interview is a recorded discussion between a trained oral historian and an interviewee or narrator oral histories may be narrowly focused on a particular event or era of historical significance that the narrator participated in or witnessed what is oral history oral history is a method of conducting historical research through recorded interviews between a narrator with personal experience of historically significant events and a well informed interviewer with the goal of adding to the historical record the oxford handbook of oral history brings together forty authors on five continents to address the evolution of oral history the impact of digital technology the most recent methodological and archival issues and the application of oral history to both scholarly research and public presentations the volume offers diverse perspectives on oral history is a sound recording of historical information obtained through an interview that preserves a person s life history or eyewitness account of a past experience but read on oral history is both the oldest type of historical documentation and one of the most modern initiated with reel to reel recorders at columbia university in the 1940s and now taking advantage of 21st century digital technologies historians need oral history whenever possible we need to seek out people who lived through the times we study and ask them if they re willing to share their memories with us doing so helps us turn characters into real people the oral history association offers a rich variety of publications guidelines toolkits and resources for those interested in every facet of oral history oral history principles oral history helps round out the story of the past oral history provides a fuller more accurate picture of the past by augmenting the information provided by pub lic records statistical data photographs maps letters diaries and other historical materials new york times editors choice a shocking groundbreaking oral history of the infamous rikers jail complex and an unflinching portrait of injustice and resilience told by the people whose lives have been forever altered by it

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
