this book examines china s national security strategy by looking at the three major elements foreign policy energy security and naval power all interactive and major influences on china s future and its relations with the united states a decade and a half into the twenty first century beijing requires reliable access to energy resources the navy to defend that access and foreign policies to navigate safely toward its goals most importantly the people s liberation army navy plan must be able to safeguard china s regional maritime interests especially the sovereignty disputes involving taiwan and the yellow east china and south china seas many chinese naval officers and analysts think the united states is determined to contain china and prevent it from achieving the dominant historical position to which it is entitled this view has been strengthened by washington s shift to asia transfer of naval units to the pacific and the march 2015 maritime strategy released by the u s navy marine corps and coast guard china s relationship with the united states is vital to both countries and to the world the relationship is based on both common and divergent interests in economics military operations and political goals and methods china s international trading economy and ambition for a world class navy require effective foreign diplomacy and participation in global affairs this policy trifecta in large part defines china s posture to the world beijing is approximately halfway toward its mid century goal of deploying a navy capable of defending china s perceived maritime interests china s priorities follow president xi jinping s definition of national security as comprehensive encompassing politics the military the economy technology the environment and culture what this means for future chinese foreign policy choices as naval modernization and energy security concerns enable different courses of action lies at the center of this book s conclusions

the past hundred years in china have seen almost continuous transformation and upheaval from confucianist hierarchy to warlordism from

cultural and economic disintegration reunion and revolution on an unprecedented scale beginning with the overthrow of the emperor in 1911 moise guides us through a century of ever unfolding drama with characteristic clarity and balance examining the effects of the communist revolution he argues that in the early days mao zedong established the most effective government china had ever known and that even during the bizarre excesses and blood letting of the cultural revolution there were still issues that were dealt with in a rational and effective manner moving on to the developments since the death of mao in 1976 in a section fully revised and updated for this new edition moise gives a nuanced account of the two sides of china its spectacularly successful programme of capitalist economic development and its continuing dictatorship he contends that dictatorship is now much less total than it was until the mid 70s although dissenters are still persecuted their very existence is evidence of a significant loosening of repression however there is a heavy price being paid for the chinese economic miracle the environmental effects of this boom already stretch well beyond the borders of china modern chinasends us a clear message the rapid and fundamental change that has framed the last century has not slowed or stalled but acts as a pointer to the near certainty of significant further change to understand china s future we must understand its past edwin e moise is professor of history at clemson university south carolina and a specialist in the history of china and vietnam his previous works include land reform in china and north vietnam 1983 and tonkin gulf and the escalation of the vietnam war 1996 the phenomenal growth of chinese economic and military power in the first decade of the 21st century has drawn world wide attention perceptions of china s rise have shifted from seeing china as a threat to a more mixed view where china is seen as playing a key role in economic recovery taking an increasingly responsible role in world affairs and contributing significantly to scientific and technological advances this book argues that china will only become a truly global power when its rising power status is accepted or at least tolerated by other major powers and china s neighbours filling a major gap in the existing literature it presents a comprehensive overview of how china s rise is perceived in a wide range of countries and regions these include china s neighbours other world powers the parts of china not part of mainland china taiwan hong kong and macau and regions of the world where china is having an unexpected impact such as the middle east it also examines changing perceptions of china in the western media overall the book demonstrates that whilst many countries and regions are much more positive about china s rise than they were before considerable nervousness and concern persists many believed that the world would remain everlastingly unchangeable in the aftermath of victory of the allies the united states the soviet union china united kingdom and france in world war ii they remodeled the world map amongst themselves and affirmed that they will be guarantors of the international status quo however those who pledged to conserve peace are now breaking it leading the planet to the edge of clash this book differs from all others that dealt with possible world war iii scenarios since it combines knowledge in the fields of history international relations economics sociology and psychology and philosophy thus giving the reader a broader outlook on such matters as potentially any survival guide for depressed teens by cobain rn c bev free spirit publishing 2007 paperback revised edition
