based organizations benefited through new partnerships grant sources and service delivery models academic researchers highlighted new grants research partners publications and career advancement costs to project partners included heavy demands on time an added burden of work frustration with the process missing other opportunities potential loss of anonymity and loss of control care needs to be taken to ensure that concrete benefits accrue for all project partners and that these benefits outweigh associated costs sub study 2 three options for dealing with misrepresentation in a qualitative cbpr project are presented omit the data treat data cautiously and include data regardless theoretical epistemological and methodological challenges of each approach are discussed given the cbpr context of the study a larger stakeholder group was consulted to inform decision making it decided to include the data and treat it cautiously the book provides researchers students and practitioners
