were so often over concerned with testing that they sometimes forgot about how to take care of the whole patient dr theodore e woodward 1914 2005 who was famous for his dedication to patients once during a snowstorm he hitched a ride on a snowplow to see his patients at the hospital he is responsible for the epigram when you hear hoof beats think of horses not zebras dr edmund pellegrino respected for his studies in bioethics his interest in protecting the sanctity of the doctor patient relationship has particular importance in our current era when it seems that the art of medicine seems to be overshadowed by the business of medicine he discusses this in his essay the commodification of medical and health care dr paul farmer also is deeply concerned with the ethical ramifications of the commercialization that is overtaking the health system he is devoted to improving public health on a worldwide scale the author finishes up with some practical tips such as how to
